Looking back in April, our children had so much fun getting familiar with: Mother Earth!

First, we learned that earth is the third out of the eight planets in the solar system. Thrilled by the marvelous universe, our little children created their own solar system during their art project.



We all love mother earth and want to make our planet a much more beautiful place. On Earth Day- Thursday, April 22nd, we walked to the Lake Cunningham Park and picked up a great deal of trash. We are so proud of our children who understand that we need to protect mother earth and that together, we can make a difference!

We also delved into the structure of earth. In order to make it more vivid and tangible for our little ones to understand, we used play dough to make layers of earth:



- Crust: brown
- Mantle: red
- Outer core: orange
- Inner core: yellow

There was so much excitement in the air during this process! Everyone was fully engaged and very proud of themselves once their “earth” was made! We then cut through the earth Ms. Sierra had created (none of our children would like to cut through their beautiful earth ☺), so that everyone could see clearly all those layers inside the planet. It was such a fun lesson for all of us!



Towards the end of April, we also learned about earth’s revolution and rotation. We began to understand that it takes a year – 365 days for the earth to orbit around the sun, and 24 hours for its own rotation!

Character Education – Courage

By reading books and discussions, our children studied the trait of being courageous in April. We were surprised to find out in the book “Bravery Soup” that the monster was afraid of Carlin, a little skunk who was so scared of monsters! We like the words from the Big Bear “You are braver than you think!” In addition, our little ones exercised this trait by having the courage to:



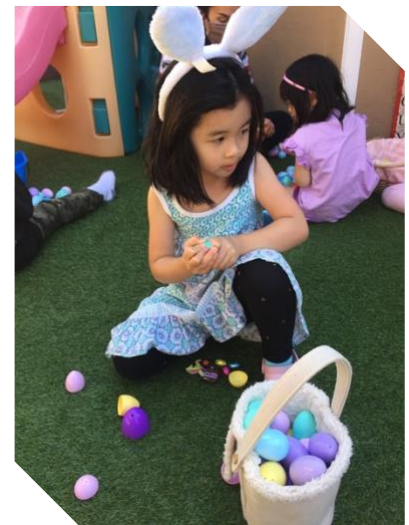
1. Take challenges to do things that we were afraid of
2. Ask for help when needed
3. Tell others to stop when they are not following class rules
4. Overcome our fear for unknown things, such as monsters

Language Learning

In April, we continued to learn conversational language in Chinese and Spanish. Chinese is such a complicated language which consists of Pin Yin (phonics), Han Zi (characters), and Sheng Diao (tones). We are delighted to see our children making progress day by day!

We began the month by celebrating Easter on Friday April 2nd. Aiming to give our children a wonderful experience, we hid six different kinds of eggs on four areas – our neighbor’s front yard, school front yard, inside the classrooms, and school backyard (playground). Montessori Wisdom

Teaching of the Child

“Look what the educationist does for the child. He speaks and speaks to the child and thinks most untrue things because he imagines the child understands nothing. If the child is not capable of being interested in the poor things the adults say, they become severe and oblige the child to repeat what they say. But the child is not only a creative personality, but a personality that can be in contact with God himself. Yet he cannot be in this contact if he has not achieved a certain independence from adults. The child looks for his independence first, not because he does not desire to be dependent on the adult, but because he has in himself some fire, some urge, to do certain things and not other things. This is his inward law. However much you speak and speak, you accomplish nothing, because the child cannot take directly but only indirectly. This is the teaching of the child.”

“What makes him choose one object rather than another? It is not imitation since there is only one example of each object, and if one child is using it at the time no other child can use it.

Therefore it is not imitation. This may be shown even in the way that the child uses the material: he becomes so attentive to what he is doing and so immersed in his work that he does not notice what is going on about him but continues to work, repeating the same exercise dozens of times over. This exemplifies that phenomenon of concentration and the repetition of an exercise which is connected with a child’s inner development. No one can concentrate through imitation.”
